Christmas is a time to give a special gift and be grateful for gifts received. Have you ever considered gifting a set of square dance lessons as a Christmas present? Square dancers have unique ways of gifting. They assist new dancers in their journey to master square dance calls; and they work hard to raise funds to keep square dance organizations going. Money sometimes gets gifted from one square dance organization to another. In Jan 2018 the Mountain Dew-ers received a \$766 gift from the Area 2 Callers and Cuers Association. In Feb 2021 the Mountain Dew-ers received a \$500 gift from the Palouse Promenaders. These gifts kept the cost to square dance with the Mountain Dew-ers below the cost to dance with other clubs.

The largest gift , \$2,713.88, came from former square dancers/clubs who belonged to the AREA II Lewis & Clark Square & Round Dance Association. This gift is similar to receiving money for a designated purpose from a "rich uncle". This gift is being used to partially fund the **2024 Idaho State Square and Round Dance Festival June 13, 14, and 15 in Kamiah.** Because of this gift, local square dancers have the opportunity to dance to a national caller without having to travel.
